Letter from the Executive Directors

2022 was a positive and promising year throughout LSF. Trevor returned to Nepal for the first time since COVID started. Seeing the Nepal Team and especially the Little Sisters were both moving and powerful experiences.

It is truly amazing how well the Little Sisters perform in school, individually and collectively. LSF's year-on-year continuation rate is well over 99%, which is unheard of for female education in Nepal. Over 97% of Little Sisters enroll in higher education, more than 3X the national average and Little Sisters are over 3X more likely to score exceptional marks on national exams. These successes come down to the leadership and commitment from the Nepal Team and the guidance of our Coordinating Mentors.



The really remarkable achievements, however, are most evident in our graduates. Their successes are mind-boggling. Our graduates work in every field you could imagine from healthcare to architecture, from teaching to aerospace engineering and from computer science to Nepali literature. Little Sisters are smashing cultural barriers and challenging archaic beliefs that limit opportunity for young women in Nepal. We could not be prouder of these young heroines and could not be more grateful to YOU! The Power of Connection: Nilu's Story

Nilu became a Little Sister in 2007 when she was in 4th grade. Despite societal pressures and pervasive gender discrimination, her parents wanted to provide their three daughters with a quality education. They chose to leave their village in eastern Nepal to move to Kathmandu in search of a better education for Nilu and her sisters.



"I believe LSF has profoundly shaped the woman I have become," Nilu said. "It instilled in me a sense of connection, support and the knowledge that I am part of something bigger, a community of Little Sisters that will always be there for one another."

Nilu is currently working on her PhD in Molecular and Cellular Physiology at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center in Shreveport, Louisiana. Her research was published in *Frontiers in Molecular Biosciences*, a leading journal in the field. Nilu's work shows the direct interaction between cancer cells and fibroblast leading to cancer progression. In April 2023, Nilu presented her work at one of the largest cancer conferences in the world.

Teachers Training Teachers

In 2022, LSF launched the Teacher Training Academy (TTA), a comprehensive, ongoing teacher training and support system that will positively impact educational outcomes for thousands of students in Nepal for years to come.

The goal of the TTA is to provide young teachers with training in up-to-date, childcentered teaching methods and techniques which will allow more teachers to encourage critical thinking, meaningful learning and practical application from their students. This in turn, will allow students to bring about significant change in their schools, communities and country throughout their educational and adult lives.

The Teacher Training Academy is led by LSF's teacher-trainer, Sangita, along with three experienced subject-specific educators. The first cohort of eight teacher trainees graduated from the intensive 3-month program in September 2022. These young teachers are now equipped with new skills and abilities that will help them better manage their classrooms, inspire their students and improve the overall quality of the learning environment throughout Nepal.

In 2022, LSF was financially supported by **223 Individuals + 37 Foundations.**




Little Sisters in Healthcare

Little Sisters are having tremendous positive impacts on the healthcare system in Nepal as they become doctors, nurses, radiologists, dentists, optometrists and more. Since the first Little Sister graduated in 2002, over 120 Little Sister graduates have entered the medical field.
